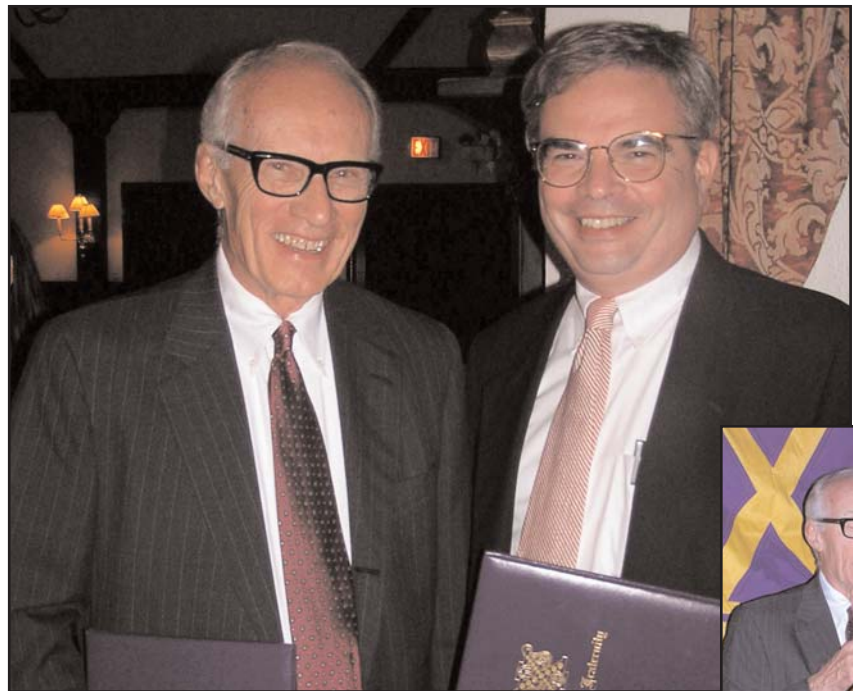
Thoren and Humphris Honored on Founders Day

It was one of those rare nights that lived up to its billing. On May 22, close to sixty alumni and active Zeta Delta Brothers gathered at the Edgewood Valley Country Club to celebrate the 163rd birthday of Chi Psi and the 92nd birthday of Alpha Zeta Delta, and also to honor some of those Brothers who have made a promising future for our Alpha possible.

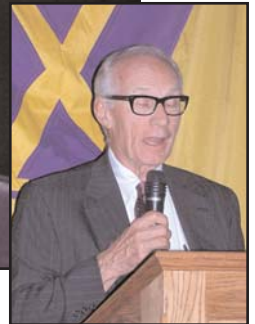
Brothers Tom Humphris, ZΔ'53, and Stan Thoren, ZΔ'69, were each recognized with Chi Psi's Alumni Recognition Award. The ARA is the highest honor bestowed upon a Brother on the Alpha level, and is presented on behalf of the national Executive Council of Chi Psi Fraternity, by nomination of the Alpha or Corporation. Brothers Humphris and Thoren join a list of previous Zeta Delta ARA winners that includes Frank Huffman '44, Dave Romoser '65, Mark Sieja '75, Steven M. Smith '77, John Evens '80, and most recently Todd Fouts '89.

Brother Thoren has served the Educational Foundation for over fifteen years as President, Vice-President, and Treasurer. He has provided stability and leadership to one of the largest Educational Foundations in the country during a tumultuous period in our Alpha's history. The Foundation has been largely responsible for the survival of the Alpha in the aftermath of the sale of the Lodge in 1994, and Brother Thoren has been there every step of the way. He accepted the award on behalf of the entire Foundation, displaying the selflessness that makes Stan such an incredible Brother in Chi Psi.

Brother Humphris, who had given a heartfelt keynote address only moments before receiving his award, has been involved in Chi Psi since his days as an undergraduate. He has served tirelessly on both the Corporation and Foundation boards, and has been a mainstay at Chi

Psi gatherings for more than five decades. His most recent involvement has been as Secretary of the Foundation, and since the sale of the Lodge his investment advice has proved invaluable. He is also an active member of his community, and stays very much involved with the Rockford Area Illini Club.

Other award recipients included recent graduate Bobby Ennesser, ZΔ'04, who was selected by the undergraduate Brothers to receive this year's H. Seger Slifer award. The Slifer award is given to a member of the outgoing senior class who has performed outstanding service to his Alpha and has exemplified the ideals of Chi Psi. Brother Ennesser held a number of positions over his undergraduate years, including #2 and most recently Social Chairman. He is a true Chi Psi gentleman, and members of the Alumni Corporation look forward to working with Brother Ennesser in the coming years.

Though he was unable to attend this year's Founders' Day Banquet, Brother Jim McElwee, ZΔ'91, was awarded with the Outstanding Service Award. This award was created by the Alumni Corporation last year to honor those Brothers who have demonstrated exceptional dedication during their period of service to the Corporation, either as an officer or member of a committee, but whose service had often gone overlooked. Brother McElwee has loyally served as an officer of the board for over ten years as treasurer, vice-president, secretary, and property and risk manager. He is stepping down from the board this October, and his service will be missed.

Founders' Day is the biggest night of the year for Alpha Zeta Delta, and this year's banquet was a tremendous success. Please mark your calendars now for May 21, 2005, and be sure to join us for next year's celebration.

Rock's Last Inning Heroics Cap Unthinkable Comeback

Alums Beat Undergrads Again

On a day where their chances of winning at one point looked as ominous as the skies above, the alumni rallied behind the play of game MVP Gary "Rock" McCormack '71, and pulled off a come-from-behind 14-13 victory over the undergraduates in the third annual softball challenge.

The key play came in the bottom of the ninth inning. With Rock on second, Jim Nielsen '01, lined a base hit to left field. Rock rounded third when he saw that sophomore Mike Baldi had forgotten to cover home plate, and beat third baseman Bill Novak in a foot race to the plate to score the tying run. Brother Nielsen moved into third with Novak's back turned, and came home to score the winning run on a fly ball by Neal Rushforth '03.

That capped what had already been a tough day for young Brother Baldi. Two innings earlier, he shocked everyone in attendance by striking out looking. That's

right, he struck out looking. In softball. He had also failed to cover home plate earlier in the game, and displayed absolutely no speed on the basepaths or fielding ability whatsoever. If the undergrads hope to have a chance of winning next year's softball game, they will undoubtedly need to find a replacement for Mike Baldi.

Not everyone in the active's lineup was horrible, however. Scott Kolman led the team with 7 hits, helping the undergrads get out to a 9-3 lead by the 5th inning. Bobby Ennesser seemed to be on base all day, and even Jeff May impressed his counterparts with his solid play in the field.

But it wasn't enough to hold off a never-say-die team of alumni, who kept chipping away at the seemingly insurmountable lead. With the score 13-9 with

The undergrads had men on second and third with no outs in the top of the ninth, but remarkably failed to score, setting up the dramatic finish.

Capital Campaign Update

On December 15, 2004, your alumni corporation will purchase the Lodge at 110 East Armory. To finance this necessary acquisition, your Alpha will undertake a multi-year capital campaign. With a goal of \$575,000, it is important that we have participation from all Brothers who have shared in the Chi Psi experience.

Currently, we are in the process of identifying class leaders for the campaign. A class leader 1) participates in screening and rating of prospects in their classes and surrounding classes, 2) solicits classmates or identifies the appropriate solicitors, 3) keeps class members up-to-date on renovation and campaign activity, and 4) makes efforts to get classmates to attend events and homecoming activities.
